


Additionally, the ambassadors provided guidance on the procedures for registering for voter ID cards. They explained the online registration process, walking students through the necessary steps to complete their



Response. Check if the casualty is responsive or unresponsive. As you approach them, introduce yourself and ask them questions to see if you can get a response. Kneel next to their chest and gently shake their shoulders, asking, 'What has happened?', 'Open your eyes!'.

- If the casualty opens their eyes, or gives another gesture, they are responsive.
- If they do not respond to you in any way they are unresponsive and should be treated as quickly as possible.

Airway. Next, you need to check that the airway is open and clear. Open the airway by placing one hand on the forehead to tilt the head back and use two fingers from the other hand to lift the chin.

If they are unresponsive, you need to move on to breathing as quickly as possible.

**Breathing.** You now need to check if the casualty is breathing normally. Place your ear above their mouth, looking down their body. Listen for sounds of breathing and see if you can feel their breath on your cheek. Watch to see if their chest moves. Do this for 10 seconds.

- If they are unresponsive and not breathing, you need to call 112 for emergency help and start CPR straight away. Ask a helper to find and bring a defibrillator (AED).
- If they are responsive and breathing move on to circulation.

Circulation. Once you have established they are breathing, look and check for any signs of severe bleeding.

- If they are bleeding severely you will need to control and treat the bleeding by applying direct pressure to the wound. Call 112 for emergency help.
- If they are unresponsive and breathing but with no bleeding, put them in the recovery
  position and call 112 for emergency help.

If there are no injuries and the person is breathing, raise the person's legs above heart level if possible. Prop up the person's legs about 12 inches (30 centimeters). Loosen belts, collars or other tight clothing. To reduce the chance of fainting again, don't get the person up too fast.

#### What to do if someone is unresponsive

- 1. Open their airway
- 2. Tilt head
- 3. Check for normal breathing for up to 10 seconds
- 4a. If they're breathing normally:

Put them in the recovery position. Then call 112 for emergency help

4b. If they're not breathing. Call 112 for emergency help. Start CPR

#### What to do if someone is unresponsive and not breathing normally

- 1. 1. Call for help Tell them to call 112 and find an AED.
- 2. Pump Give 30 Chest compressions at a rate of 100–120 per minute.
- 3. Breathe Give two rescue breaths. If unwilling or unable, do chest pumps only.
- 4. Continue to pump and give rescue breaths until help arrives.
  - 2. Trial On Dummy By Students

Trainers taught students the CPR procedure on a dummy body. Students actively participated and took initiative to learn individually.

The workshop primarily targeted students of all the batches of BCIHMCT. The event provided them with an opportunity to learn about Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and using a Automated External Defibrillator (AED).

Event Write-up: Banarsidas Chandiwala Institute of Hotel Management and Catering Technology organized a Self-Defense session for first-year and second-year girls in collaboration with the 'Women Power Association (NGO)' led by Mr. Vikas Jhanjot, from 12<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> August 2024.

The session began with Mr. Vikas introducing the NGO 'Women Power Association' and outlining its goals. He emphasized the importance of self-defense, explaining why every girl should know basic techniques to protect herself when needed. He then demonstrated fundamental moves, such as escaping from grips on the wrist, waist, and from single and double locks.

On the second day, the girls were trained in techniques to prevent attacks involving guns and knives, as well as methods to avoid kidnapping and respond to inappropriate touches in public areas. Techniques included using elbow strikes to the face, groin, and other vulnerable body parts, and methods to prevent choking. The session also covered how to defend against acid attacks and chain snatching, common crimes women face.


The third day focused on reviewing the techniques learned in the first two days. Students were then taught how to escape from body locks and free themselves when pinned down


by an attacker. Mr. Jhanjot concluded the session by commending the students' attentiveness and wishing them well.
