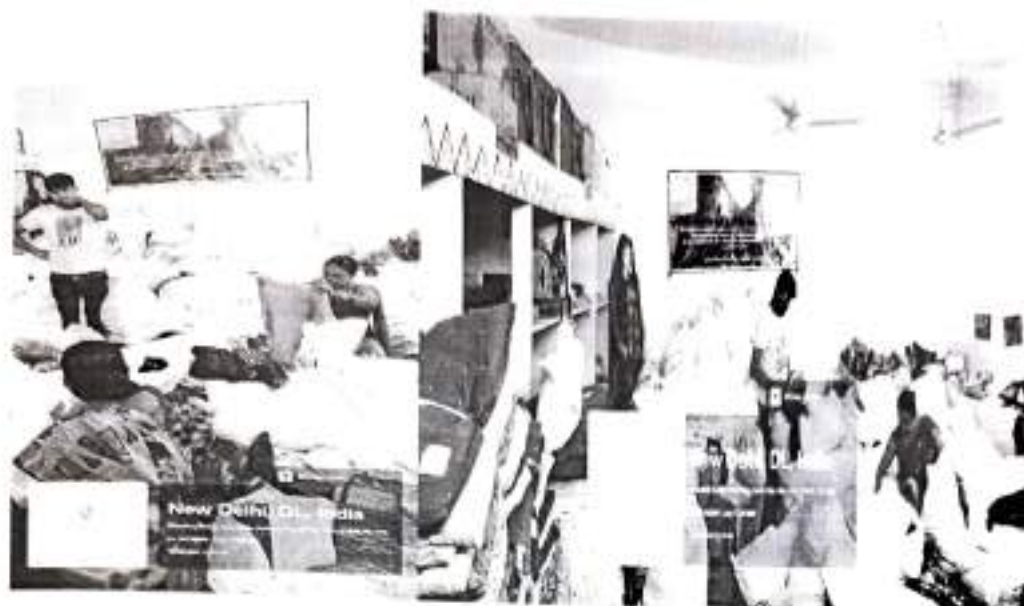


Goonj aims to build an equitable relationship of strength, sustenance and dignity between the cities and villages using the under-utilized urban material as a tool to trigger development with dignity, across the country. Their one of the main initiatives is NGPC- (not just piece of cloth). Their impact is on education, health, sanitation, livelihood, environment, Disaster Relief & Rehabilitation, and many more issues of the society.

They have separate rooms and separate area for a particular issue, the students were taken first to a special room for clothes which were sorted with different particulars like age gender, they checked their qualities as they don't want to hurt the sentiments to whom they are providing the clothes. they also make marriage kits for the people, drama clothes, sarees are some other essential products like soaps shampoos nail cutters etc.

In 1998 this concept was started and in 1999 it came into process, which was started by Mr. Habib with just 64 clothes from his home and now they have headquartered one in Delhi and another in Rishikesh and many offices in the metropolitan cities.

Clothes kits are prepared region wise according to the traditions of the states. They use the word DIGNITY instead of the word CHARITY.

Disaster Management Room- They provide utensils and daily use things at the time of natural disasters, usually they don't work for rations but in the difficult times of covid they held a big drive and not just during the disaster Goonj believes in giving a basic life to the needy people after disaster to start with a basic livelihood for which they provide kits like cycle repairing kit, cobbler kit, electrician kit, painter kit, mason kit.

They have a display board on which it has the pictures of their staff members and other people working with them. They have a separate section of all the stationery items and books where they make kits with every basic requirement. They provide kits and some electronics to the rural schools as well. Not to forget about their expensive and important resource – the instruments which everyone even in urban areas cannot afford, they believe rural people in village are no less with talents.

There were also different sections of the menstrual health and sanitation where they make cotton sanitary napkins for the rural women and have separating washing units for the same. Ladies were also working on the sewing machines, produced different handloom products keychains, pouches and bags for dignity.

### Awareness creation regarding ban on sharp Manja in NCT of Delhi.

Kite flying is a very popular sport amongst children during and after the Independence Day celebration in the month of August every year.

However, manja is used in kite-flying competitions is often coated with adhesive and powdered or finely crushed glass, metal, or other materials to make it sharp. It's deadly for thousands of pigeons, crows, owls, endangered vultures, and other birds, who are often wounded or killed when they become entangled in the strings. However, the government of the National Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi went a step further and banned the production, storage, sale, and use of all forms of manja – including cotton threads coated with glass, metal, or any other sharp material – making these actions punishable offences under Section 15 of the Environment Protection Act (EPA), 1986.



On 10<sup>th</sup> August, 2020 on the same guidelines BCIHMCT conducted an online awareness campaign amongst the students to ensure the kite flying is done only with a cotton thread. Few students had written articles on the same and participated in the event. The objective was to make the students and the community at larger scale aware about the harmful effects of glass manja

By training its students in every aspect, promoting awareness and by standing firmly behind the government in its effort, we hope to play our part and to continue our initiatives in grooming the students virtually

### Go Green with Green Crackers

On the auspicious occasion on Dussehra, a virtual poster making competition was organized. The topic was to spread awareness about the harmful effects of bursting fire crackers and the importance of green crackers. Due to the worsening air quality in the capital, it has become pertinent for humans to educate themselves and sensitize people about the health hazards and ill effects of breathing polluted air; firecrackers being the major reason. The rising health issues among elderly and kids due to air pollution calls for a shift from conventional to green crackers.

The green crackers were developed by the Indian Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and include flower pots, pencils, sparkles, and chakkar. The water molecules produced in the green crackers help reduce the dust and harmful elements, thereby reducing the small particle emission by almost 35%. They also produce less SMOG, which has been rising up by 30% from past 5 years. Also the sound is not very loud, which reduces the damage to ears. Green crackers are said to cause lesser garbage, thereby aiding PMs "Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan". These crackers are also safe for pets and street animals who may get harmed or scared and there is reduction in the number of fire related accidents.

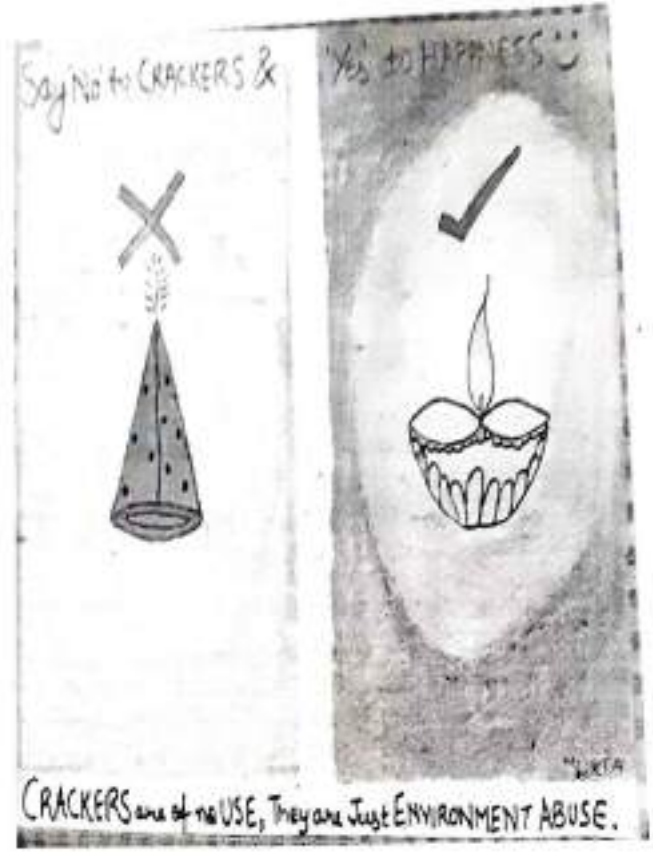

## Ek Mutthi Daan

We at BCIBMCT take pride, feel joy and believe in the power of giving, therefore took an initiative named " Ek Muthi Daan". A team of 2nd year students - Chaitali Mazumdar, Vihan Bhardwaj. Simren pal, Simran passi, Mihir bhasin, Rahul Sharma, Vansh berry, Naren bhardwaj

Gandharv Punyani, Rishabh Gulati, Gautam Malhotra & Aditya narula under supervision of faculty Ms. Gagandeep Soni representing the institute visited Goonj, Sarita Vihar where contribution in the form of rice and other grains including clothes were donated to the NGO after a week long collection from students & faculty of BCIBMCT.

The team was first briefed about Goonj, it's initiative and vision for which it came into existence by the Founder Mr. Ayush Gupta 20 years ago. First they were shown the Sorting room where all type of clothes that were contributed were further sorted on three major categories that are obtained in good condition, minor repair or which are beyond repair that were at last had to be recycled.

Next room was for kit setup where items contributed were arrange according to different needs and were then put into different kits.

The kits were presented as rewards to areas where people are in need across the nation. Goonj prepared a variety of kits such as Anganwadi, Office, family, male marriage and female marriage kit.

Next room consisted of areas like gents footwear, ladies footwear, children footwear, bags, utensils and umbrella that were received from the contributors and stored.


Goonj has a disaster relief and rehabilitation initiative called as "Rahat" where people who lost their families and home received kit prepared using resources needed during an emergency.

Moving forward towards a room consisting of articles such as children clothes, bedsheets, new clothes and woollen as well as school uniforms. This room mainly worked to motivate and bring similarity among rural and urban area children by preparing and keeping up school uniforms.

Next there was a passage where all contributed sarees, school related material and spectacles were kept. Goonj started off with a "School to School" initiative where left over materials of urban goods are stored for rural people. The school students promoted plantation and therefore were rewarded with kits.

A book store having a collection of reading and informative contributed books was gathered from urban as well as rural areas. Goonj offers library and School kit to the students who have enrolled up willingly to participate in Goonj work and provide their contribution.

Next was a room full of all types of stationery whether it be old or new articles. These acted as a very essential part of kit to be rewarded among the people in "Anganwadi" and "Rahat"

Next was the area where clothes were washed, sun dried, ironed and obtained in a size of 13x12 cm to make "My Pad". In the my pad room the cloth were obtained in the size of 16x12 cm, in a set of 5 which is being used in the process of menstruation. A leaflet is given to people stating the method of use of the My Pad which gets stored in banner of

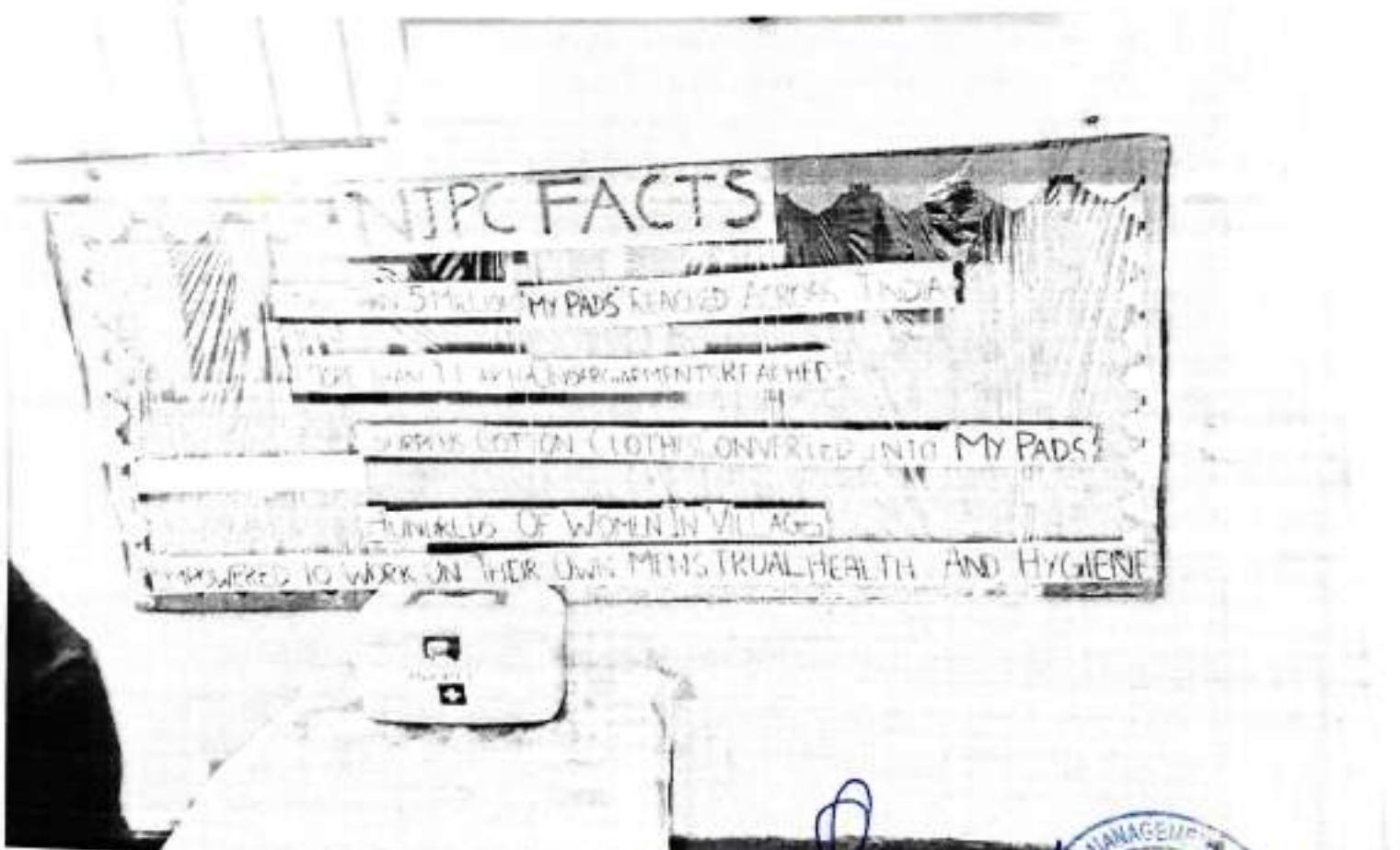


fax. Goonj conducts session in order to make people aware about menstruation. The people attending the session are provided with a kit.

Coming to the arrangement of funds by Goonj, it is working on rent basis and has over 900 plus employees. The major expense incurred by Goonj is transportation of material. Students were shown a room consisting of one side used printed paper, scrap pins, marriage card and envelope that were used in record keeping. Newspaper was used to make bags.

Last was the stitching unit where mat, bags, cushions, bottle cover, ball, vegetable bag, pouch and school bag were prepared out of cloth that is recycled. In order to contribute in monetary terms the people take gullaks and fill them with money and return when filled as their contribution.

It was a very interesting and educating visit for all the students

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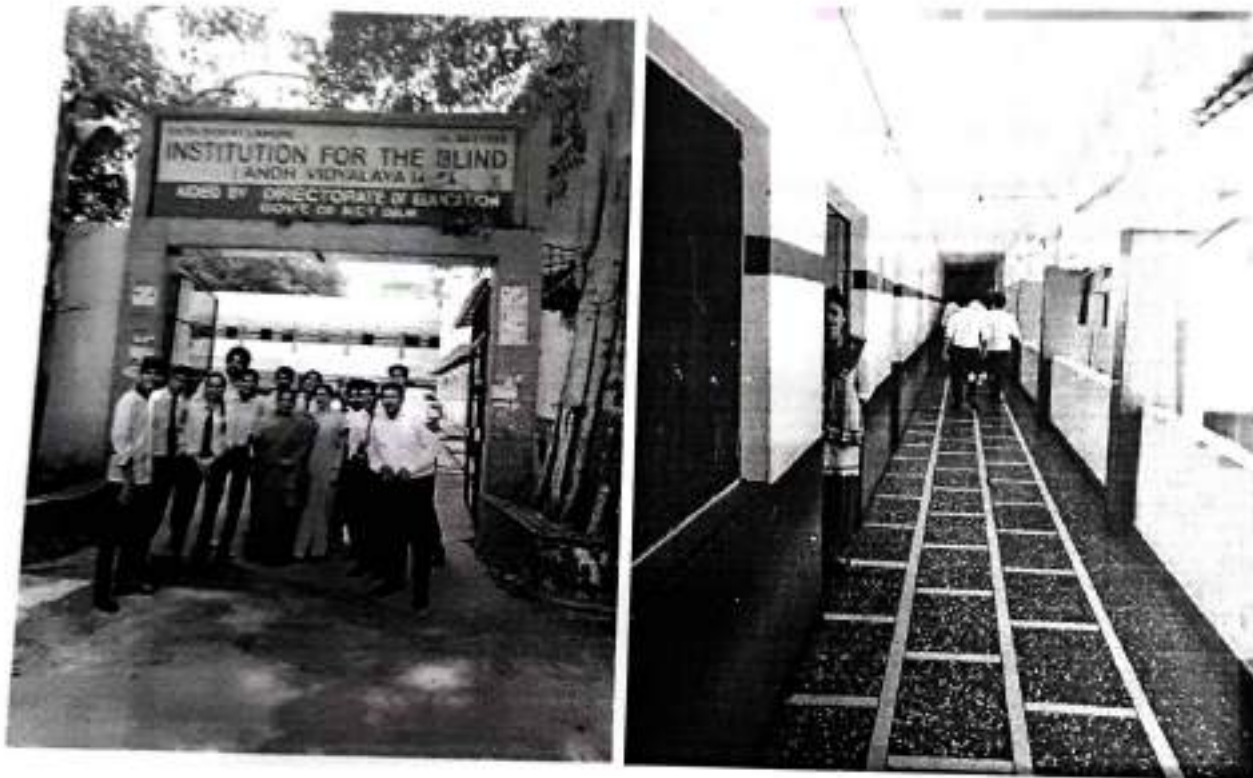

Light refreshments (by BCIMCT Team) were distributed amongst the blind school students.



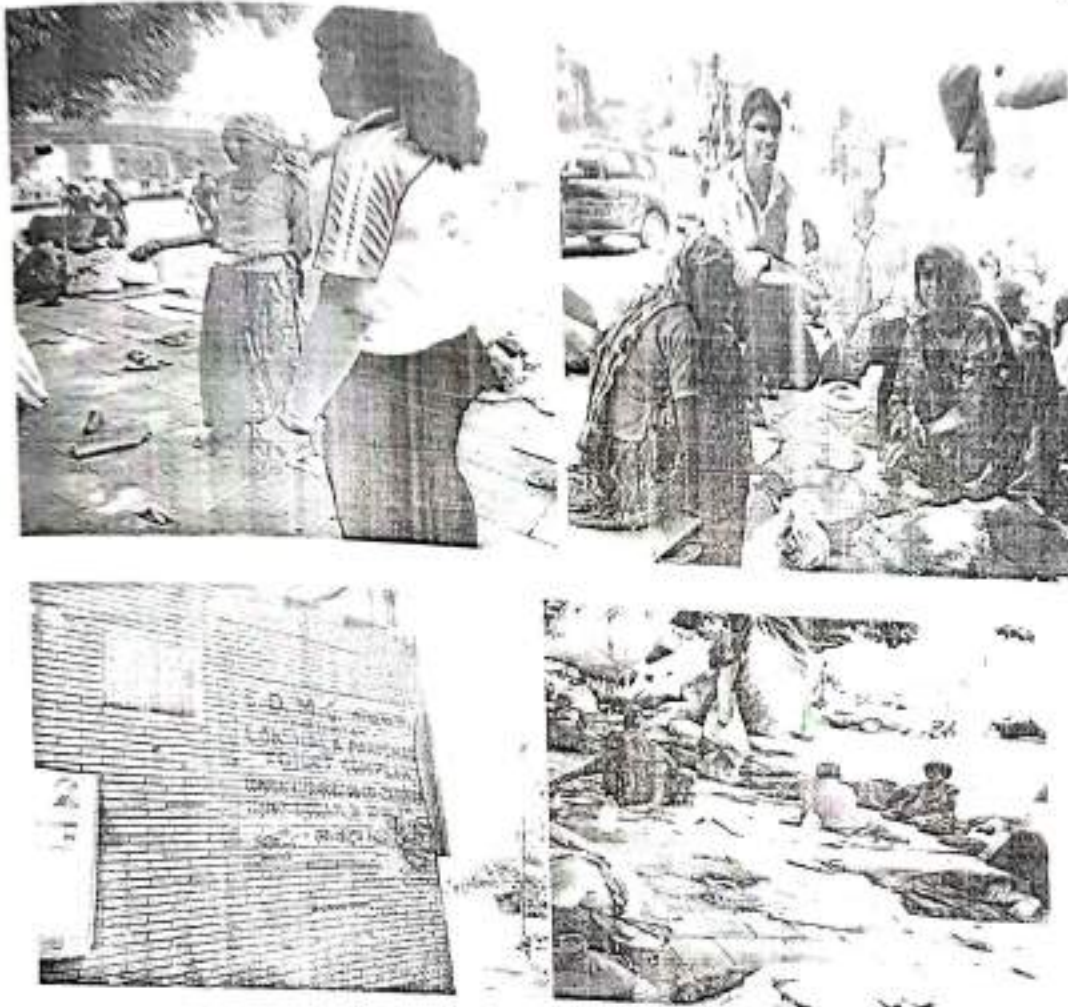
